

Media Coverage: Idaho Innocence Project, Stoel Rives' Attorneys Secure Certificate of Innocence for Idaho Man Wrongly Convicted of Rape and Murder

Stoel Rives' attorneys Wendy Olson, a former District of Idaho U.S. Attorney, and Andrea Carone assisted the Idaho Innocence Project at Boise State University in securing a certificate of innocence for Charles Fain, who spent 18 years on Idaho's death row after his wrongful conviction in the rape and murder of a 9-year-old girl in 1982.

Though Fain was released in 2001 based on new DNA testing that excluded him as a suspect, it wasn't until 2019 that further DNA testing pointed to a new suspect who was apprehended and has been charged with the murder.

As well as officially being declared innocent, Fain is entitled by Idaho law to financial compensation for the wrongful conviction.
